<b>Section 1A:</b> National Standard EMT-Basic Refresher Course, adhering to the 1994 EMT Basic Curriculum	Completion of a National Standard state-approved EMT Basic refresher program is required, consisting of a minimum of 24 hours (listed on the below). May be completed through state or CECBEMS approved continuing education as long as your state does not mandate completion of a formal EMT-Basic refresher course. 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<b>Section 1B:</b> CPR certification	Submission of approved CPR credential for the professional rescuer. Credential must be current to the March expiration date. Verification may be in the form of an instructor's signature on the reregistration form or copies of both sides of a current cards attesting to the following skills: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Adult 1 and 2 Rescuer CPR</li> <li>• Adult Obstructed Airway Maneuvers</li> <li>• Child CPR</li> <li>• Child Obstructed Airway Maneuvers</li> <li>• Infant CPR</li> <li>• Infant Obstructed Airway Maneuvers</li> </ul>																		
<b>Section II:</b> Additional 48 hours of EMS related continuing education	Any subject covered in the National Standard EMT Curricula and/or Basic/Advanced/Rescue topics will be accepted as continuing education. These topics may be presented through workshops, seminars, didactic sessions, or other state approved in-service training. You may accrue no more than 24 hours towards this section from distributive education that is approved by CECBEMS provided the program was approved after January 1, 2002. For a listing of approved programs contact CECBEMS at <a href="http://www.CECBEMS.org">www.CECBEMS.org</a> A maximum of 24 hours may be applied towards this section in any one subject with the exception of those listed below. Ex: A Hazmat course that was 40 hours would only be awarded 24 hours of continuing education towards this section. 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# The National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians

## Reregistration Requirements for NREMT Basic



The National Registry will accept, on an hour per hour basis, EMT course instruction. Instruction of an entire DOT EMT –Paramedic course will fulfill the requirements listed in Section 1A and Section II.

The National Registry will **not accept** the following as continuing education:

- \* home study programs
- \* volunteer time with agencies
- \* clinical rotations
- \* preceptor hours
- \* performance of duty
- \* serving as skills examiner
- \* first aid courses
- \* first responder course
- \* instructor courses
- \* management/leadership courses
- \* CPR - except for teaching hours

# The National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians®

## EMT Basic Reregistration Requirements

### Applicant must:

1. Be actively working within an emergency medical service, rescue service, or patient health care facility using his/her EMT skills;
2. Complete all educational requirements prior to the March expiration date;
3. Complete the reregistration report in its entirety and submit completed report by the March expiration date;  
**Note: Reregistration forms are mailed in November, prior to your expiration date. The forms must be postmarked no later than the March 31 expiration date. *\*\*EMTs requiring a National Registry card to work must submit reregistration materials to the NREMT by mid-February of the year of expiration date.***
4. Complete a state approved National Standard EMT – Basic Refresher course adhering to the 1994 DOT EMT Basic Curriculum;
5. Obtain CPR certification at the appropriate level current to your March expiration date;

6. Complete 48 hours of ***additional*** continuing EMS related education as outlined in this document.

**\*\*** All continuing education hours, to include the refresher, must be completed within the current reregistration cycle. Education completed prior to your previous March expiration date will **NOT** be accepted. If this is your first reregistration, only education completed after the date of the initial registration will be accepted.

7. Maintain skills as verified by your Training Program, Director of Operations or Physician Medical Director. (Requires signature on your reregistration report validating competency of skills).
8. Submit reregistration fee of \$10.00.

The National Registry reserves the right to investigate reregistration material at any time from the registrant. Registrants must retain verification of attendance of all education they acquire. Failure to submit education when audited will result in denial of eligibility to reregister.

### Terms of Registration

In applying for reregistration, registrants agree to comply with all reregistration requirements, rules and standards of the NREMT. The registrant bears the burden of demonstrating and maintaining compliance at all times. The

NREMT considers the individual to be solely responsible for his/her registration.

Individuals must notify NREMT, within 30 days, of change of mailing address. Change of mailing address can be made via our website: [www.nremt.org](http://www.nremt.org)

Individuals must notify the NREMT, within 30 days, of any felony convictions.

Individuals must notify the NREMT, within 30 days, of any disciplinary action taken by a state that has resulted in the following:

- Suspension, revocation, or expiration of state registration/license
- Termination of right to practice
- Voluntary surrender of state registration/license while under investigation

### Disciplinary Policy/Revocation of Certificates

NREMT has disciplinary procedures, rights of appeals, and due process within its policies. EMTs applying for registration or reregistration who wish to exercise these rights may contact NREMT for copies of the Disciplinary Procedures. Requests to appeal must be submitted within thirty (30) days of receipt of notice of the determination.
